You may type or handwrite your letter. Please make it neat. Remember you are writing this to your teacher, so make sure your spelling, grammar and punctuation are correct.

- Describe the character
- Select a word or phrase that best describes the character & explain why. Give a few examples from the story to support your ideas.

- Compare the character to another character from a DIFFERENT book, TV show, or movie. Explain why you think they are alike.
- Why you liked this character.
